### **Dear Families**

Those of you who visit our site each day, will have seen that our builders have very much made themselves at home. Thank you to all families for bearing with us during the works, we have an anticipated end date of February 2025. Further communication about the works will follow over the next few months from the contractors, including an exciting competition for pupils. We appreciate the impact the works have on families particularly at the drop off and collection and have reached out to Cllr Mallon and the Parish Council to set up a meeting as soon as possible, to discuss traffic and other relevant issues and opportunities. Space Makers was developed in response to the growing mental health crisis among young people as a way of encouraging a time of daily reflection away from the pressures of school and society. In a world where communication is increasingly digital, we are looking forward to introducing this across the school to support the mental health and selfworth of the children.

The summer term sees a wealth of other exciting opportunities too. From virtual trips to Ancient Greece, to actual visits to Osmington Bay and Cotswold Wildlife Park and more bringing learning to life. Please do check out our website calendar to see what's coming.

Our school field is now open at lunchtimes for Key Stage 2, with our outdoor gym also open for these year groups. 



### Year 1

We are reading a poem by Eloise Greenfield By Myself and preparing to write our own poems.



### Year 2

Year 2 have made a fabulous start to our topic 'Magnificent Monarchs'. So far, we've learnt about absolute power, royal residences and timelines. In English, our focus text is 'The Day the Crayons Quit'. Taking inspiration from letter writing, the children wrote a letter to King Charles III, inviting him to school for tea and biscuits. Fingers crossed we get a response....

In Art, the children have been studying the Japanese artist, Yayoi Kusama. Having been inspired by her work, we created our own flower sculptures.



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In music, Year 2 have been exploring improvisation and learnt much about rhythm and dynamics using a range of percussion instruments. They have particularly loved playing the African drums! In link to our magnificent monarchs, the children explored rhythms in names such as Queen Elizabeth, King Charles and Prince William.





### Year 3

We are studying 'Beautiful Botanicals', learning about botanical art and what it means to be a botanical artist. In our school garden we explored the visual elements of botanical subject matter in petals and leaves. We sketched them from different angles and recorded swatches of the colour we could see.







### Year 4

In history we have been studying 'Ancient Civilisations'. We have been looking at many artefacts which have provided us with evidence about the past. The design, decorations and materials used provided us with evidence of the wealth, power and status of the object's owner. We have been very creative in Art with moulding our very own Ancient Sumerian statuettes. Have a look at some of the fabulous results from (in order) Ellie, Primrose, Zach, Mia and Rafe!





Linked to this learning, we have also been studying the story, 'The Egyptian Cinderella.'

We designed our own posters written from the point of view of the person who has lost an item or from the Pharaoh Amasis, trying to locate the wearer of the rose-gold coloured slipper so that he could make the maiden his queen!

### Year 5

We are learning about the Ancient Greeks this term. As a springboard for our learning, we had a virtual reality experience. It was great! We learned about the gods and their different roles. We found out that the Greeks invented the Olympics, but at that time only men could compete, which they did naked. We learned about mathematicians and philosophers, and we can recognise the different styles of columns that the Greeks used in their important buildings, Doric, Ionic and Corinthian.



### Year 6

Some of Year 6 attended a Tag Rugby event at The Warriner last Thursday – the children played well, displaying our school values of inclusivity and determination and showed sportsmanship throughout.

Year 6 have enjoyed the start of our new Science topic: 'Circulatory System'. The children have completed some excellent research, coming up with their own questions and using a range of sources to find out the answers.



In RE, all the children are building on their prior learning about Islam. Their big question: Does belief in Akirah (life after death) help Muslims to lead a good life? We have questioned our perceptions of Heaven and Hell, as well as what we do to lead good lives and why we do that. The learning about Islamic practices has been very enlightening for the children.

We are busily preparing for the KS2 SATs and are proud of the children's continuous positive attitude to their learning. We are certain that they are all going to shine!

### **Collective Worship**

The children and adults have been learning about a new way 'to normalise the contemplative within their lives' (ODBE Contemplative Toolkit) through calming practices. The aim is to help everyone to flourish as human 'beings' as opposed to human 'doings'. To find Peace and Hope, to realise dreams and find deep fulfilment. For some, there may be an experience of or a growth in Faith. Ask the children to show you what they have been doing.
