Other Governor Roles: Learning and Teaching Deputy Lead Governor and member of Headteacher Performance Committee and Pay Committee



Suzette was born in New York City, studying dance and the arts professionally from age three. She is an alumnus of the world renowned LaGuardia High School of Music and the Arts, the Martha Graham Center of Contemporary Dance, and Jacques D'Amboise's National Dance Institute in New York City. She holds multiple professional qualifications, including a graduate degree from Trinity, Laban (London). Suzette is a polymath, and amongst other skills is a trained paralegal, editor, security supervisor, martial artist, personal license holder, first aider and fire marshal. An active parishioner, reader and intercessor in the Oxford Diocese, Suzette has been on the Parish Church Committee of St Laurence's Milcombe for some years. She is the safeguarding officer and has been elected as church warden again this year. Suzette is a committed Christian, a student of theology, biblical studies, and church history.
