

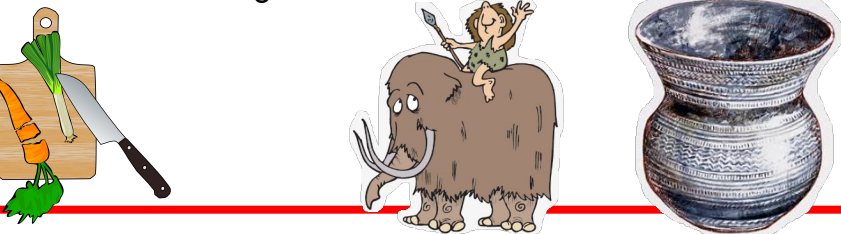
History – Through the Ages

Within this project the children will learn about British prehistory from the Stone Age to the Iron Age, including changes to people and lifestyle caused by ingenuity, invention and technological advancement.

Linked to our Stone Age learning, the children will learn about Bell Beaker pottery. This allows the children to explore different clay techniques, which they use to make and decorate a Bell Beaker-style pot.

Science - Cook Well, Eatwell

Children will explore the importance of a balanced diet by learning about different food groups and the Eatwell Guide. They will investigate a range of cooking methods and develop their practical skills by preparing and creating healthy recipes, using their knowledge of ingredients, nutrition and design criteria.



French

In French we will be learning the alphabet and phonetic sounds. Children will be focusing on their verbal pronunciation of letters and sounds.



English – Skara Brae and Stone Age Boy

This term the children will be focusing on two books called 'Skara Brae' by Dawn Finch and 'Stone Age Boy' by Satoshi Kitamura.

While looking at Skara Brae, the children will be exploring a holiday brochure style text and applying their knowledge gained of Skara Brae to create sentences of persuasive writing.

When looking at 'Stone Age Boy' the class will explore a narrative text that rounds off our learning on prehistoric times and follows the adventure of a school-age boy through time. The final work produced will consist of a brochure of a prehistoric site, and a narrative story of a child who goes on an unexpected adventure.

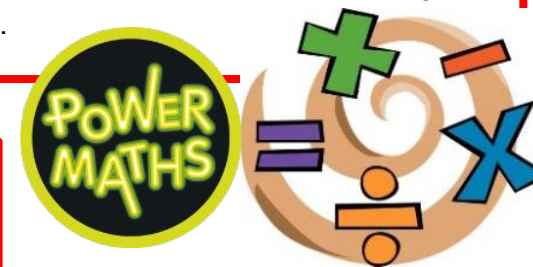


Mathematics

Place Value within 1,000 – Children will develop their understanding of numbers to 1,000 by representing, comparing and ordering 3-digit numbers. They will use practical resources, such as place value counters, place value grids and number lines, to deepen their understanding.

Addition and Subtraction – Children will build on their Year 2 learning by using practical resources and written methods to solve addition and subtraction calculations with increasing confidence.

Multiplication and Division – Children will explore multiplication and division through equal groups, arrays and sharing, using practical equipment and pictorial representations to support their learning. They will also begin to learn and apply the 3, 4 and 8 times tables.



IT - Self-Image and Identity

Children will explore the meaning of identity and how people can represent themselves in different ways online. They will learn how online identities can change depending on the platform or activity they are using, such as gaming, avatars or social media, and understand the importance of making safe and responsible choices online.



Physical Education

During our indoor PE lessons, the children will be focusing on strengthening their bodies through yoga poses and improving well-being.

Our outdoor lessons will be focusing on football and the ability to control the ball whilst moving and sending/receiving the ball with accuracy.

Please note that swimming sessions will begin from **Week 2 of Term 1**.

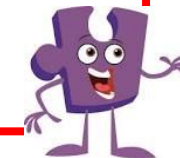
Children will develop their swimming strokes, breathing techniques and stamina through regular sessions. The order of classes attending swimming will be confirmed shortly, and families will be updated once arrangements have been finalised.



JIGSAW (PSHE) – Being Me in My World

The children will explore what it means to be a valued member of their class and school community. They will learn about their rights and responsibilities, understand how their ideas and opinions help shape our class Learning Charter, and discuss how the choices they make can have positive or negative consequences.

Through these lessons, children will develop a sense of belonging, respect for others, and an understanding of how they can contribute to creating a happy, safe and supportive learning environment.



Religious Education

The theme that children will be focusing on is based around the teachings of Christianity. Children will explore the concept of the Gospel and the teachings of Jesus, including how he showed love, kindness and compassion towards others.

They will consider the following question: **How are different people inspired by the teachings of Jesus?** Children will explore how Jesus' actions and teachings influence the beliefs and actions of Christians today.



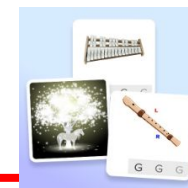
Art - Contrast and Complement

This project teaches children about colour theory by studying the colour wheel and colour mixing. It includes an exploration of tertiary colours, warm and cool colours, complementary colours and analogous colours, and how artists use colour in their artwork.



Music - A Shining Performance

This unit is based around the song Sparkle In The Sun. You will sing, play instruments in two or three parts, and compose two pieces of your own. The first is inspired by glistening artwork, and the second by the given title 'Glittering Night'.
