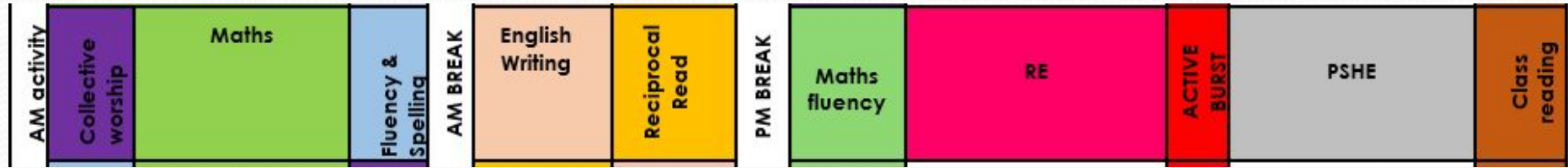
As well as our writing lessons, we complete regular reciprocal reading sessions, daily reading fluency and SPaG sessions.

Home Learning

School Requirements

Reading - We ask that your child reads every day. To support your child's reading, they will bring home their reading book and reading record. Please bring them back to school every day so we can hear them read in school. Please note, this may not always be recorded in their reading record.

Maths – To support your child's Maths learning, we will set tasks on Maths Flex which link to our classroom learning. We ask for at least 30 minutes per week.

Spellings - Weekly list and activity on Spelling Shed.

Home Learning continued . . .

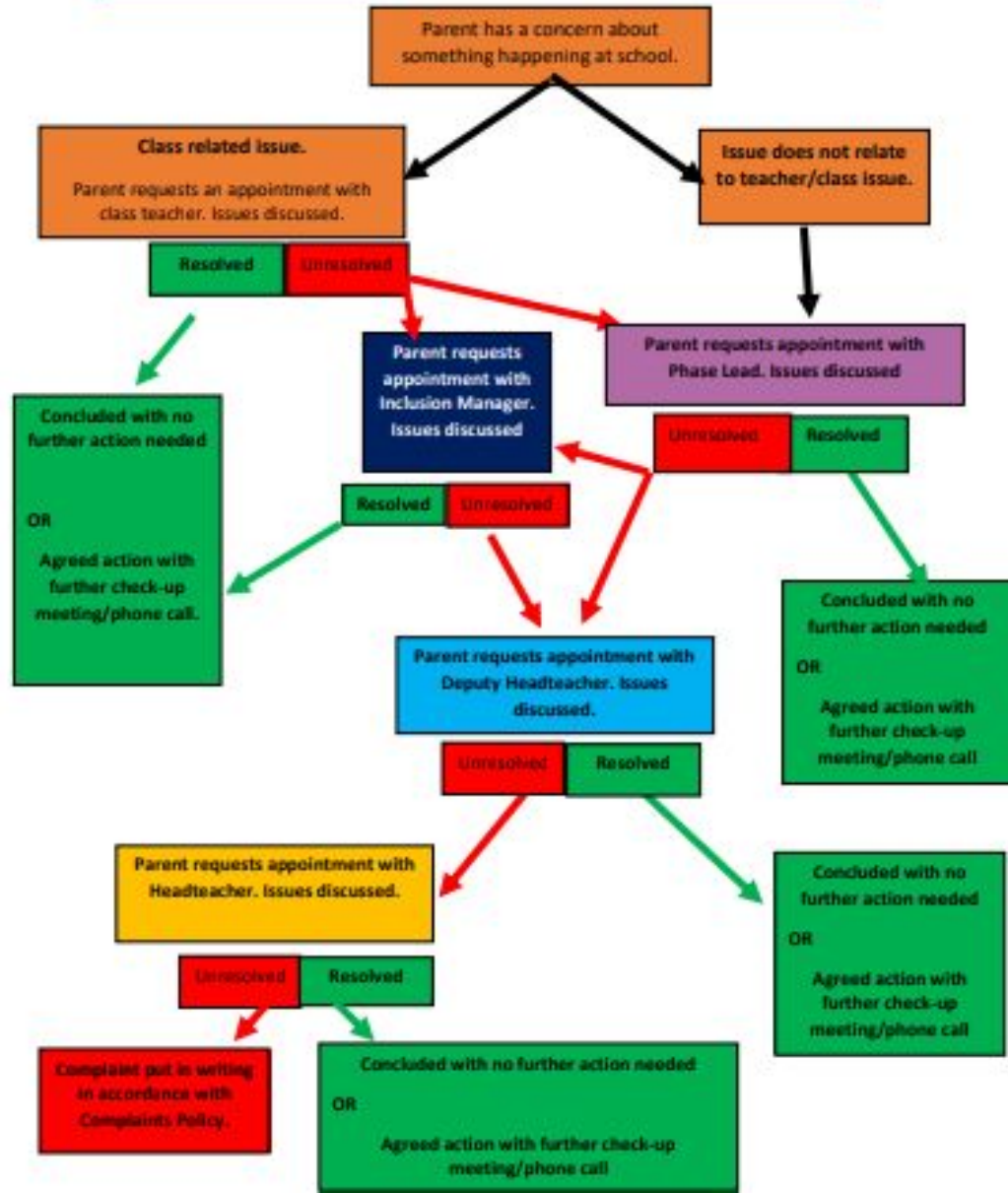
SATs Prep and Focused Learning

This year we are trialing an extra set of home learning which is not compulsory but highly recommended! It will come in the form of a set of tasks - one Maths, one English and one Topic related - which deepen the learning and help to prepare the children for the SATs. 2 half-hour lunchtimes slots will be provided each week if it is not possible to be completed at home and your children are still keen to do them!
